Horse Eligibility

The American Quarter Horse Association was organized in 1940 with intent similar to FQHR. Therefore, FQHR recognizes those horses listed in the first five studbooks (first 27,000 horses registered) as Foundation bred.

Most individuals carrying 75% Foundation blood are eligible for registration. The fourth generation is critical (great grand sires and great grand dams), of that generation 75% should descend from or run to Foundation blood. No registered Thoroughbred may be closer than the fourth generation. Those families known to carry H.Y.P.P. are not eligible for registration regardless of generation or testing.

In addition, our show format provides the opportunity for horse-rider teams to compete in all categories toward a Versatility Award. Versatility is the most coveted of the awards because it showcases the capabilities of the Foundation Quarter Horse.

OkFQHR offers clinics each year in a variety of events. These clinics are designed to be inexpensive and assist exhibitors improve in their desired disciplines. The clinic schedule firms up the quarter prior to each clinic. For 2012, the first two clinics are planned to be cattle clinics. Members may participate in either or both as they desire.
